On the prayer of Mr. Bimalendu Das, learned counsel appearing for the State, time to file report in the form of affidavit stands extended till today, the report filed in Court today, is taken on record. Copy has already been served.

Identically, by extending the time, the exception filed by the petitioner in Court today, is taken on record.

Learned counsel for the State has placed a Circular dated **September 16, 2011**, the same is taken on record.

Clause V to the said circular shows that, those casual/daily rated/contractual workers who will complete **10 years' of service on 1st July every year** will come under the purview of that circular provided, no such workers if engaged after **April 1, 2010**, will come under the purview of the said order. The said Circular dated **September 16, 2011** is taken on record.

At this juncture, learned counsel for the petitioners prays for some time to produce the Office Memo dated **January 16, 2019** which is referred to in the Engagement Letter of the petitioners dated **May 7, 2019, Annexure-P2 at page 21** to the writ petition on the next day.

For the ends of justice, such an opportunity is granted.

The writ petition shall appear under the heading **“Motion (Service Matter)”** on **July 30, 2025**.
