

CRR 2073 of 2026

In the matter of : Ashalata Biswas & Ors.

Opposite party no. 2/de facto complainant claims to be the father of one Rakesh Biswas, since deceased.

It appears that the dispute between the parties has arisen in relation to the disbursement of compensation awarded by the District Legal Services Authority, Lunglei District, Lunglei, on account of the death of the said Rakesh Biswas. It further appears that the compensation amount was credited to the bank account of petitioner no. 1, who is the grandmother of the deceased.

The records further disclose that the mother of the deceased expired when Rakesh Biswas was approximately two and a half years old.

Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioners submits that petitioner no. 1, being the grandmother of the deceased, had assumed the responsibility of bringing up and taking care of Rakesh Biswas since his early childhood. According to the petitioners, the dispute between the parties is essentially civil in nature.

In view of the aforesaid circumstances, there shall be a stay of all further proceedings in connection with Tehatta Police Station Case No. 864 of 2023 dated 05.11.2023, corresponding to GR

Case No. 8972 of 2023 under Sections 420/323/325/120B of the Indian Penal Code, 1860, presently pending before the learned Judicial Magistrate at Tehatta, Nadia, for a further period of twelve weeks from the date of this order.

Let a copy of the application, along with a copy of this order, be served upon the opposite parties, with intimation that the matter shall be taken up for hearing after six weeks under the heading "Contested Application."

The petitioners shall file an affidavit of service on the next date of hearing.
