1. Record reflects that pursuant to the previous directions of this Court, a Radiogram message followed by an Email was duly dispatched to the Deputy Commissioner of Police, Zone-3, Central Region, Mumbai Police Commissionerate by the Ld. Counsel for the State, for the purpose of ensuring the appearance of Opposite Party No. 2, Inditrade Fincorp Ltd., formerly known as JRG Fincorp Ltd.
2. Learned Counsel appearing for the State reports that despite the transmission of these official communications, no response has been forthcoming from the concerned police authorities, nor has any appearance been entered on behalf of the said Opposite Party.

3. Mr. Dipta Dipak Banerjee, Learned Advocate appearing for the Petitioner, invites the attention of this Court to the affidavit-of-service filed earlier. It is submitted that the revisional application and the requisite notice were dispatched to the registered postal address of Opposite Party No. 2. The postal track report indicates that the consignment was returned with the endorsement "Left," dated 20th November, 2025.
4. It is well-settled that when a notice is sent via Registered Post to the last known correct address of a party and is returned with an endorsement such as "Left" or "Refused," it constitutes deemed service in the eye of the law.
5. Having perused the record, this Court is satisfied that the petitioner has taken all requisite steps to effectuate service. Accordingly, the service upon Opposite Party No. 2 is accepted and treated as complete.
6. In view of the above, let the matter appear in the list on 26th February, 2026, under the heading "For Hearing."
