1. Petitioner is the nephew of the missing person.
2. On the previous date, it was submitted on behalf of the petitioner that, the missing person is likely to be located at Ashar Alo Welfare Society, Murshidabad.
3. Considering such statement, we directed the State to submit a report.
4. Report submitted by the State be taken on record.
5. Report states that, the missing person is presently located at Ashar Alo Welfare Society, Murshidabad. The missing person was admitted at such society by the brother of such missing person.
6. Apparently, there are disputes between the petitioner and his uncle with regard to the custody of the missing person. Since, the location of the missing person is now known to the writ petitioner, he is at liberty to take appropriate steps so far as custody and

care of the missing person is concerned, before the appropriate forum.

7. In the facts and circumstances of the present case, we are not minded to invoke our extraordinary writ jurisdiction of Habeas Corpus.

8. WPA (H) 60 of 2026 is **disposed of** accordingly.
