In this application, the petitioner has prayed for quashing of the entire criminal proceeding in connection with G.R. case no. 1058 of 2025 arising out of Bidhannagar South Police Station case no. 190 of 2025, presently pending before the learned Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate, Bidhannagar.

Being aggrieved by the aforesaid proceeding, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that he has been falsely implicated. However, in pursuance of the verbal and written compromise agreement arrived at by and between the parties, the petitioner has made partial payment towards the total settled amount of Rs. 1,00,00,000/-, which has been duly accepted and acknowledged by the opposite party no. 2 by way of executing valid money receipts. The factum of amicable settlement has been brought on record by the Trial court and the defacto-complainant appeared before the Trial court and had stated that the matter in dispute has been settled and he had no objection to the prayer of the accused person in releasing them on bail. Therefore, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that further continuance of the impugned

proceeding in view of such settlement would be nothing but a mere abuse of process of the court.

Having heard learned counsel for the petitioner, the application is admitted.

Petitioner is directed to serve a copy of the application upon the State through the office of Public Prosecutor, High Court, Calcutta and upon the opposite party no. 2 by speed post intimating the next date of hearing and to file affidavit of service on the returnable date.

Let the matter appear three weeks hence before the Regular Bench.

Petitioner will be at liberty to pray for interim relief and also will be at liberty to file connected application, if any, recording amicable settlement.
