1. Parties are represented through their respective learned counsels.
2. Mr. Chatterjee, learned counsel for the respondent/State submits a report of the respondent no.3 i.e. S.D.O., Diamond Harbour after serving copies to the learned arguing counsel for the petitioners and for the private respondent nos.9 and 10. The report is taken on record.
3. Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the private respondent nos.9 and 10 submits that he has not received a copy of the instant writ petition.

4. In view of such, we request learned counsel for the writ petitioners to supply a copy of the instant writ petition to the private respondent nos.9 and 10 positively within two working days from today, if not served in the meantime.
5. Liberty is given to the private respondent nos.9 and 10 to file Affidavit-in-Opposition within three weeks hence after serving advance copies of the same to the learned counsels for the writ petitioners and for the State.
6. Affidavit-in-Reply, if there be any, is to be filed within one week thereafter.
7. List thereafter.
8. Liberty to mention.
9. Before parting with, it is, however, ordered that the prohibitory order as and by way of interim measure as passed on 02.03.2026, shall continue till the last day of June, 2026 or till further order, whichever is earlier.
