1. Affidavit of service filed by the petitioners in Court today be kept with the records.

2. The petitioners participated in the recruitment process for engagement in the post of Instructor in the trade of Electrician.

3. The petitioners are unsuccessful in the recruitment process. They allege that the private respondents are ineligible to participate in the recruitment process as they do not possess the requisite qualification and certificate required for the same.

4. Learned advocates representing the private respondents and the Public Service Commission deny the submission of the petitioners.

5. It has been contended that the private respondents have all the requisite documents and qualification for the job.

6. The Public Service Commission is directed to prepare and circulate a report along with all supporting documents apropos the allegations made in the writ petition by the petitioners by April 13, 2026.

7. Re-list the matter on April 20, 2026.

8. The issue of maintainability of the writ petition at the instance of the unsuccessful candidates raised by the learned advocate for the respondents is left open to be decided at the time of final hearing of the writ petition.
