2. Learned counsel for the opposite party nos. 1 and 2 and learned counsel for the opposite party nos. 4(a) and 4(b) are seeking time to file affidavit-in-opposition.
3. Learned Senior Counsel for the petitioner, appearing through VC, has opposed the same and submits that these are delaying techniques.
4. Last opportunity granted.

5. Let opposite party nos. 1, 2, 4(a) and 4(b) file affidavit-in-opposition within four weeks with copy to the learned counsel for the petitioner. Reply, if any, be filed within two weeks thereafter with copy to the learned counsel for the opposite parties.

6. Learned Senior Counsel for the petitioner further submits that the petitioner apprehends that opposite party nos. 4(a) and 4(b) may create third party interest which shall further complicate the issue.

7. Learned counsel for the opposite party nos. 4(a) and 4(b) has fairly submitted on instructions that opposite party nos. 4(a) and 4(b) are not contemplating to create any third party interest. Learned counsel submits that any such situation, the opposite party nos. 4(a) and 4(b) shall proceed only in accordance with law.
