1. Affidavit-of-service filed on behalf of the petitioner is taken on record.
2. Matter is heard in presence of the learned advocates representing the petitioner and Union of India.
3. Petitioner participated in the selection process for being appointed as Constable (GD) under Central Armed Police Forces (CAPFs).
4. On being qualified in preliminary round of selection process petitioner participated in Detailed Medical Examination which was conducted on 17th November, 2025. Petitioner was declared medically unfit on account of Cubitus Valgus.
5. Petitioner questioned report of Detailed Medical Examination by preferring review and Review Medical Examination was conducted on 26th November, 2025.
6. In Review Medical Examination petitioner was also

declared unfit on account of Cubitus Valgus and medical expert on measurement indicated in Review Medical Examination angle in respect of right hand was 21° and angle in respect of left hand was 22° .

7. Learned advocate representing the petitioner disputes measurement taken in Review Medical Examination to find out the angle and according to the petitioner Rampurhat Medical College on examining petitioner prepared a report on 11th December, 2025 wherefrom it appears that in right hand angle is 14° and in left hand angle is 15° which is under prescribed limit.
8. Clause VII (2) of revised medical guidelines of May 2015 provides carrying angle is one of the grounds to declare candidate unfit provided measurement of angle goes beyond prescribed range. As per Clause VII(2), normally such angle is found to be 10° - 15° in males and in female it is 15° - 20° .
9. It is also provided therein that candidates with carrying angle upto 20° may be accepted if the same is not associated with abnormality of elbow joint.
10. In the present case in Detailed Medical Examination there is no indication of measurement of angle but in Review Medical Examination it was

found that in right hand such angle is 21° and in left hand it is 22° whereas Rampurhat Medical College on examining the petitioner on 11th December, 2025 measured angle in right hand 14° and in left hand 15° .

11. Since two divergent opinions are found on deformity i.e. carrying angle, Court finds it apt to direct All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS), Kalyani to examine the petitioner and file a report disclosing measurement of carrying angle in both hands of the petitioner on the next date.
12. List the matter under the same heading for further consideration on 18th February, 2026.
13. Learned advocate for the petitioner is directed to communicate this order to the Registrar, AIIMS, Kalyani by 28th January, 2026 for taking necessary steps.
