In CRAN 1 of 2025 is an application by the applicant/revisionist to seek for interim order in the case to the effect that the proceeding in connection with NJP Police Case No. 210 of 2025 now pending before the learned Sessions Judge, Jalpaiguri be stayed during pendency of the instant revision.

According to the applicant/petitioner the instant criminal case is the second in line, on the similar allegations as the first FIR, which has been challenged earlier before this Court in a revision.

On the selfsame allegation the second FIR would not be maintainable, as stated by the learned senior counsel appearing for the

petitioner.

Mr. Pandey, learned advocate appears for the OP 2 and raises strong objection.

I find that the criminal revision is required to be heard on merit in presence of both the parties.

In such view of the fact it is found proper to direct stay of all further proceedings as of now before the learned trial Court.

Therefore, let there be an order of stay of all further proceedings before the learned Sessions Judge, Jalpaiguri in connection with NJP Police Case No. 210 of 2025 dated 2.4.2025 for a period of three months from today.

Let the opposite parties including the State file affidavit-in-opposition, if any, within a period of three weeks.

Affidavit-in-reply be filed within a period of one week thereafter.

Let this matter come up for hearing before this Court after four weeks.
