O R D E R

On 16.04.2021, following order was passed by this Court:

"Mr. Sudhir Nandrajog, learned Senior Advocate submits that the petitioner has already been afforded the facility of custody parole for one day to attend the wedding of his daughter to be performed on 21.04.2021.

He further submits that he may additionally be granted the facility on same terms for two days i.e. the day of engagement to be performed on 20.04.2021 and the day of bidai on 22.04.2021.

Issue notice, returnable on 19.04.2021 as Ist item on the Board.

Dasti in addition.

Liberty to serve the learned Standing Counsel for the State."

We heard Mr. Sudhir Nandrajog, learned Senior Advocate for the petitioner and Mr. Chirag M. Shroff, learned Counsel for the State.

Mr. Nandrajog submits that this Court may consider reducing the burden of expenses on custody parole to the extent possible.

Considering the entirety of the matter, we extend the period of parole for three days, that is to say, from 20.04.2021 to 22.04.2021 and direct that the petitioner may be taken out of the prison in the morning of 20.04.2021 and may be re-lodged in the prison by 6.00 p.m. on 22.04.2021.

In our view, the presence of four police personnel in plain clothes should be sufficient to accompany the petitioner for the period of parole.

With the aforesaid directions, the Special Leave Petition is disposed of.

Pending applications, if any, also stand disposed of.
