O R D E R

The appellant claimed benefit as scheduled castes candidate for admission in Goa Medical College Bambolin, Goa for the MBBS course in the session 1997-98. The prospectus provided for reservation of seats for scheduled castes candidates of Goa. Undisputedly, the parents of the appellant belong to scheduled castes as indicated in the schedule for the State of Maharashtra. It is submitted that the appellant's started residing in Goa and she herself was born in Goa. We do not think it makes any difference. The matter is covered by the decision in the case of Marri Chandra Shekharao vs. Dean, Seth G.B. Medical College & Others reported in 1990 (3) SCC 130. It is also informed that Respondent No. 11 who was given admission against the reserved seat and originally belonged to Goa, has completed the course against the reserved seat and he is doing his internship.
