a) This Hon'ble Court be pleased to restrain Respondent No. 1 by

b) This Hon'ble Court be pleased to restrain Respondent No. 2, by way of a writ of mandamus or by any other appropriate writ or directions or orders from making any payments to Respondent no. 3 for forensic audit of Petitioner No. 2."

2. By consent of the learned counsel for the parties, we dispose of the special leave petition with following modification :

Insofar as Clause (a) is concerned, we permit the petitioner to engage the services of a Chartered Accountant/Auditor of their choice and expenses by way of professional charges/fees shall be paid by the Central Government.

3. On Clause (b) of the aforesaid prayer, Shri Rakesh K. Khanna, learned Additional Solicitor General on instructions, would submit that he would not press for the relief sought in the special leave petition.

The special leave petition is disposed of accordingly.
