The learned counsel for the parties state that if
petitioner pays Rs. three lakh fifty thousand to respondent
No.1, their dispute for the purchase of the property
including the subject matter of the suit could be amicably
settled. Learned counsel for the petitioner further states

that the aforesaid amount would be paid within four weeks

from today and that he would withdraw the pending suit immediately thereafter. Learned counsel for respondent No.1 states that in this view of the matter, the dispute between the parties would not survive.

It has been further agreed that respondent No.1 would sign the requisite paper/form for transfer of electricity supply in favour of petitioner and the Electricity Board would also grant the necessary sanction for the same in accordance with the terms and conditions of Electricity supply. It is agreed that transfer papers/form would be signed within four weeks from today and that the Electricity Board would decide the application of the petitioner accordingly.

Until the decision is taken by the Electricity Board, the entire order passed by this Court would continue. This special leave petition stands disposed of accordingly.
