UPON hearing counsel the Court made the following  
ORDER

The High Court by its order dated 08th October, 2007 passed in ABA No.1498 and 1499 of 2007 had directed the petitioner to surrender before the trial court within two weeks from that date and on his surrender, he was directed to be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs.10,000/- with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of Chief Judicial Magistrate, Pakur in connection with Pakur (T) P.S.Case Nos. 151/06(GR No.406/06) and 152/06(GR No.407/06).

Since, the petitioner did not surrender before the trial court within two weeks, as directed by the High Court in the aforesaid order, he filed application Nos.2275 & 2258 of 2007 for extension of time which have been dismissed by the High Court by the impugned order. While, dismissing the application for extension of time, the High Court has also cancelled the order dated 8th October, 2007 directing the petitioner to surrender within two weeks because by that time the two weeks' time had also expired.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the case, we direct the petitioner to surrender before the trial Court within three days from today and the trial Court shall release the petitioner on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs.10,000/- with two sureties of the like amount each, as directed by the High Court by its order dated 08th October, 2007.

The special leave petitions are disposed of accordingly.
