By the impugned order, the High Court rejected the prayer made on behalf of the appellant. In our view, the prayer for transfer should have been allowed. Accordingly, we direct that Case No.99 of 2006, titled as Sanjiv Kumar vs. Suman, pending in the court of District Judge, Kurukshetra, is transferred to the District Judge, Sonapat, within the State of Haryana, who may either try the case himself or make over the same for trial to any other court of competent jurisdiction.
