O R D E R

These petitions are directed against order dated 07.01.2013 passed by the Division Bench of the Calcutta High Court in G.A.No.24 of 2013 and A.P.O.T.No.15 of 2013, whereby hearing of the appeal filed by the petitioners was expedited.

We have heard Dr. A.M. Singhvi, learned senior counsel for the petitioners and S/Shri Ashok Desai, R.S. Suri, C.A. Sundaram, learned senior counsel for the respondents and carefully perused the record.

In our considered view, ends of justice will be served by requesting the Division Bench of the High Court to make an endeavour to decide the appeal as early as possible but, latest by the end of February, 2013. Ordered accordingly.

The parties may, if so advised, file affidavits and additional documents in the High Court within a period of seven days from today. It is expected that the High Court will not entertain any request for adjournment from either side.

If any application is filed by the petitioner for interim relief, the High Court shall consider and dispose of the same on its own merits.

The special leave petitions are disposed of in the manner indicated above.
