O R D E R

Leave granted.

This appeal challenges the judgment and order dated 17.09.2025 passed by the High Court of Judicature at Bombay in Criminal Application (BA) No. 763/2025.

The appellant, Manisha has been facing trial in connection with a crime registered pursuant to FIR No. 385 of 2024 dated 14.10.2024 lodged with Police Station Mul, District Chandrapur in respect of offences punishable under Sections 189(2), 191(2), 191(3), 190, 109 and 61(2) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023 [in short, "BNS"] Section 135 of the Maharashtra Police Act and Section 4 read with Section 25 of the Arms Act.

The application seeking regular bail having been rejected by the High Court vide impugned order dated 17.09.2025, the appellant has preferred the instant appeal.

This Court vide its order dated 30.01.2026, issued notice in the instant matter.

Heard learned counsel for the appellant in support of the appeal and learned counsel for the respondent(s) and perused the material on record.

Learned counsel for the appellant submitted that the husband of the appellant has been granted bail whereas the said relief has been declined by the High Court insofar as the appellant is concerned; that she has a three year old daughter who is suffering from 88% disability (Cerebral Palsy upto 50% and intellectual disability upto 75%). In the circumstances, relief of regular bail may be granted to her as she has been in jail since 14.10.2024, i.e, for a period of one year and four months. He submitted that this Court may impose conditions on grant of bail which would be complied with by the appellant herein.

*Per contra*, learned counsel for the respondent/State on instructions submitted that the husband of the appellant has not been cooperating in the trial and has

not been appearing before the Sessions Court despite the bail conditions being imposed on him while granting bail; that if any relief is to be granted to the appellant herein, there may be frustration of the trial itself and hence this appeal may be dismissed.

Considering the facts on record, in our view, the case for regular bail is made out.

We, therefore, allow this appeal and direct as under:

"The appellant Manisha shall be produced before the concerned Trial Court as early as possible and the Trial Court shall release her on bail, subject to such conditions as it may deem appropriate to impose to ensure her presence in the proceedings arising out of FIR No. 385 of 2024 mentioned above."

It is directed that the appellant shall extend complete cooperation in the trial of the instant case. The appellant shall not misuse her liberty in any manner.

Any infraction of the conditions shall entail cancellation of bail granted to the appellant.

With these observations, the Criminal Appeal is allowed.
