There is an inordinate delay of 577 days in filing the present Special Leave Petitions. The contention that this Court had given leave to file a review is not correct. All that this Court has done, by its order dated 1st September, 2003, is to record the statement of the counsel to the effect that the petitioners seeks permission to withdraw the special leave petitions to seek review of the order of the National Commission. While so recording the Court has been careful enough to note that this statement was made after the Special Leave Petitions had been argued for some time. This indicates that the statement was made only because the Court was against the petitioners. Once the earlier Special Leave Petition, against the order dated 10th April, 2002, has been withdrawn, this subsequent Special Leave Petition against that same order cannot be maintained. The Special Leave Petitions are dismissed accordingly.
