UPON hearing counsel the Court made the following
O R D E R

The petitioners have filed W.P. Nos. 19668 and 19669 of 2004 seeking a writ of Habeas Corpus. The Division Bench before which the writ petitions came up for hearing expressed its inability to follow the two Division Bench Judgments of the same High Court in the cases of N. Rami Reddy v. Government of Andhra Pradesh [1997(4) ALT 522(D.B.)] and M. Laxmi Bai v. Commissioner of Police, Hyderabad [2003(1)ALD 35 (D.B.)]. and, in order to set the conflict at knot, referred the matter to a Full Bench for its opinion. The

Full Bench by the impugned order disagreeing with the view taken by the earlier two Division Benches' Judgments, has overruled the same. The Full Bench remanded back the case to the Division Bench for deciding the remaining points arising in the writ petitions.

The petitioners being aggrieved by the decision of the Full Bench have filed the present petitions.

Since the writ petitions are yet to be decided by the Division Bench, counsel appearing for the petitioners seeks to withdraw these petitions reserving liberty with the petitioners to challenge the finding recorded in the judgment impugned before us in case the writ petitions pending before the Division Bench of the High Court are dismissed. Dismissed in terms of the prayer made.
