These Special Leave Petitions have been filed challenging the portion of the Judgment of the National Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission by which interest has not been allowed for two years. This Court has in a Judgment in the case of Ghaziabad Development Authority v. Balbir Singh reported in 2004 (5) SCC 65, confirmed the order of the National Commission disallowing interest for 2 years. We, therefore, see no reason to interfere. The Special Leave Petitions are dismissed.
