UPON hearing the counsel the Court made the following

O R D E R

1. The petitioners are residents of Narpura Village, District Jalore. Their village was earlier part of Noon Gram Panchayat. However, in terms of notification dated 10.01.2025, after undertaking the delimitation exercise, a proposal was made to reorganise the Gram Panchayats in District Jalore, including by shifting Village Narpura to a newly created Sarat Gram Panchayat. The petitioners statedly opposed the same through various

representations, which were not considered. Thereafter, they approached the High Court, and their writ petition was disposed of on 15.04.2025 with a direction to the District Collector, Jalore to decide their representation(s).

2. It seems that opportunity of being heard was granted to the petitioners, but their representation was subsequently rejected, which prompted the petitioners to file a fresh writ petition, challenging the larger delimitation exercise and the specific issue of Village Narpura. The High Court, vide the impugned order, has dismissed the Writ Petition of the petitioners as part of a larger batch of cases challenging the delimitation exercise.

3. The petitioners have pointed out that, subsequent to the impugned order being passed, the State of Rajasthan, Department of Rural Development and Pachayati Raj has issued successive final notifications, first merging Narpura with Sarat, then reverting it back to Noon, and again reversing it to be merged with Sarat.

4. These notifications dated 21.11.2025, 28.11.2025, and 31.12.2025 having been issued after the impugned judgment of the High Court dated 14.11.2025, the petitioners are at liberty to challenge the notifications before an appropriate forum in accordance with law.

5. With the liberty aforementioned, the Special Leave Petition stands disposed of with pending application(s), if any.
