The appellants along with Nimmakayalan Nagamunireddy were tried and by judgment rendered by trial Court, Nimmakayalan Nagamunireddy was acquitted whereas the appellants were convicted under Section 302 read with Section 34 of the Indian Penal Code and sentenced to undergo imprisonment for life and to pay fine of Rs. 500/- each in default to undergo further imprisonment for a period of one month. On appeal being preferred, the High Court of Andhra Pradesh upheld the conviction. Hence, this appeal by special leave.

Having heard the parties and perused the impugned judgments and the evidence adduced on behalf of the parties, we
