UPON hearing the counsel the Court made the following
O R D E R

1. The learned counsel for the petitioner submits that while filing the appeal against the order of conviction under Section 138 of the Negotiable Instruments Act, 1881, ("NI Act"), the appellant's counsel had made a

statement that he is ready to deposit 20 per cent of the cheque amount in compliance of the statutory provision i.e., Section 148(2) of the NI Act. Based on the said statement and the statutory provision, the appellate court had directed the appellant to deposit 20 per cent of the cheque amount within 60 days from the date of its order. In these circumstances, according to the learned counsel for the petitioner, the High Court should not have entertained a revision against the interim order passed by the appellate court and reduce the amount to 10 per cent from 20 per cent as directed by the appellate court.
