



matrix of C.W.P. No.9892 of 2009 M/s Akashdeep Housing Development Finance (Pvt.) Ltd. and negated challenge to the acquisition by relying upon the affidavits filed by Joint Secretary to the Government, Haryana, Department of Industries and Commerce.

The High Court also examined the record and concluded that land of the petitioners and others has been acquired after following the procedure prescribed under Section 4 & 6 of the Act.

As regards the petitioners, the High Court noted that constructed residential house was released from acquisition and held that there was no justification to quash notifications dated 13.2.2008 and 31.12.2008.

We have heard Shri M.L.Sharma, learned counsel for the petitioners and carefully perused the record.

In our view, the detailed reasons assigned by the High Court for refusing to entertain the petitioners' challenge to the acquisition of their land are based on correct appreciation of factual matrix of the case and the impugned order does not suffer from any legal infirmity warranting interference under Article 136 of the Constitution.

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The special leave petition is accordingly dismissed.
