O R D E R

This petition is filed by the wife for transfer of a  
divorce petition under Section 13 of the Hindu Marriage  
Act, 1955 filed by the husband from the Court of Civil  
Judge, Senior Division, Pune to a court of competent  
jurisdiction at Patna.

2. Learned counsel for the resopndent-husband points  
out that the petitioner is an MBA graduate; that she was  
working in Pune in HDFC Standard Life; that the parties  
have no children and the petitioner will, therefore, have  
no difficulty in travelling to Pune to defend the case.  
Learned counsel for the respondent-husband also states that  
the respondent will pay Rs.7,500/- in regard to every trip

the petitioner makes to Pune for attending the case.

3. Having regard to the facts and circumstances and the undertaking of the husband to pay Rs.7,500/- in respect of every visit connected with court hearing, we consider that this is not a fit case for transfer. Therefore, recording the submission that the respondent shall pay Rs.7,500/- per trip, which shall be ensured by the trial Court, the petition is disposed of.

4. Having regard to the fact that the petitioner will have to travel from Patna for every hearing, we request the learned Civil Judge to dispose of the matter expeditiously.
