In view of the ailment of the petitioner, she is directe

under police surveillance to Narayana Hrudayalaya Hospital at Bangalore of

Patient under the treatment and care of Dr. Shetty himself. It is made clear

that the petitioner shall not be kept in the hospital as an Indoor Patient even

for a day more than required, strictly as per the advice of Dr. She
tety. All

expenses including the expenses to be incurred on the deployment of poli
ce

officials at the hospital during her stay there, shall be borne by the petitioner,

to which counsel appearing for the petitioner has no objection.

Subject to the above directions, the special leave petition is dismissed.
