164 of 2010) and Miscellaneous Case (No. 13 of 2010) against the wife (petitioner herein) in the court of District Judge, Howrah (West Bengal).

3. Petitioner seeks transfer of the above matters from the Court of District Judge, Howrah (West Bengal) to the Family Court, Lucknow (Uttar Pradesh).

4. Mr. Pijush K. Roy, learned counsel for the respondent submitted that the respondent is not desirous of prosecuting Matrimonial Suit (No. 164 of 2010) and Miscellaneous Case (No. 13 of 2010) filed by him in the court of District Judge, Howrah (West Bengal). He further submitted that in view of the stay order passed by this Court in these

Transfer Petitions, respondent could not apply for withdrawal of the above matters.

5. Since, respondent is not desirous of prosecuting Matrimonial Suit (No. 164 of 2010) and Miscellaneous Case (No. 13 of 2010) filed by him in the court of District Judge, Howrah (West Bengal), these matters shall be treated as withdrawn. A formal order shall be passed by the concerned court on production of copy of this order.
