UPON hearing counsel the Court made the following
O R D E R

This petition is directed against order dated 15.12.2010
passed by the Division Bench of the Punjab and Haryana High Court
whereby the writ petition filed by the petitioners questioning the
acquisition of their land under the Punjab Town Improvement Act,
1922 was dismissed.

After arguing the case for some time, Shri Ranjeet Kumar,
learned senior counsel appearing for the petitioners made a request
that his clients may be permitted to withdraw the special leave
petition with liberty to seek review of the order under challenge

because various points raised in the writ petition have not been
dealt with by the High Court.

The request of the learned senior counsel is accepted and the
special leave petition is disposed of as withdrawn with liberty in
terms of the prayer made. However, it is made clear that liberty
given to the petitioners to file review petition shall not be
construed as a mandate of this Court to the High Court to entertain

the review petition and if any such petition is filed, the High Court shall decide the same on its own merits.

While disposing of the special leave petition in the manner indicated above, we direct that the property of the petitioners shall not be demolished for a period of ten weeks.
