Delay condoned.

Having heard learned counsel for the petitioner at some length
and on perusal of the material on record, especially the statements
of the eye-witnesses PW1, PW2 and PW3 coupled with the medical
evidence, we do not find any ground to interfere with the well
reasoned judgment dated 26.03.2019 passed by the Division Bench of
the Madhya Pradesh High Court.

The special leave petition is, accordingly, dismissed.

Faced with this, learned counsel for the petitioner points out that the petitioner has already undergone sentence of about 15 years and he is eligible for pre-mature release.

If that is so, the petitioner may apply to the Competent Authority for his pre-mature release and if any such application is filed, the same shall be considered within a period of four months from the date of its receipt, in accordance with the policy/rules as were applicable at the relevant time.
