Delay condoned.

These petitions are directed against the judgment of the Division Bench of the Andhra Pradesh High Court whereby the appeals filed by the petitioner against the award passed by Senior Civil Judge, Sathupally for payment of compensation to the respondents at the rate of Rs.1,12,100/- per acre for agricultural land and Rs.65,000/- for well were dismissed.

We have heard learned counsel for the petitioner and perused the record. In our view, the award passed by the Reference Court was based on comprehensive evaluation of the pleadings and analysis of the evidence produced by the parties on the issue of market value of the acquired land and well and the Division Bench of the High Court did not commit any error by refusing to interfere with the same.

The special leave petitions are accordingly dismissed.

The State Government and the petitioner shall ensure that the amount of compensation determined by the Reference Court is paid to the respondents within a period of two months.

A report showing compliance of the aforesaid direction shall be filed in the Registry of the High Court. Thereafter, the matter be listed before an appropriate Bench. If it is found that the State Government and the petitioner have failed to pay the amount of compensation to the respondents in terms of this order, proceedings may be initiated against the defaulting officers under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971.
