UPON hearing the counsel the Court made
the following

O R D E R

1. Although, the petitioner has eight previous antecedents of committing similar nature of crime, however, in all of those eight cases, petitioner has already been acquitted.
2. In the present matter, petitioner has been granted interim protection vide order dated 26.02.2026 and there is no allegation that petitioner has misused the liberty.
3. Considering all the relevant aspects of the matter, we deem it appropriate to make the interim order absolute.
4. Accordingly, interim order dated 26.02.2026 is made absolute.
5. The petitioner is directed to be released on anticipatory bail in FIR No 1421/2024, registered at Police Station Lasudiya, District Indore, Madhya Pradesh, for the offence punishable under Sections 309(4) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita,

2023, subject to the terms and conditions as may be imposed by the Investigating Officer or the Trial Court, as the case may be.

6. In Addition, petitioner is directed to appear before the concerned Police Station on first Monday of every month during the pendency of the trial.

7. In case, the petitioner fails to appear before the concerned Police Station, as directed above, or commits any other offence, the State would be at liberty to move application seeking cancellation of anticipatory bail granted to the petitioner.

8. The Special Leave Petition is accordingly disposed of.

9. Pending application(s), if any, shall stand disposed of.
