Heard the learned counsel appearing for the petitioners.

It is brought to our notice the fact that after disposal of the  
case of Baliram Beghal in writ petition no. 1512 of 2004 and

Devnarayan in writ petition No. 1601 of 2008, a fresh show cause

notice was issued by the petitioner herein to all 228 affected

people and in pursuance of the fresh show cause notice a final  
order was also passed. It is pointed out that the aforesaid

facts, although mentioned in the writ appeal, were not

considered by the Division Bench while disposing of the writ

appeal. The counsel states that the petitioners would file a

review application bringing to the notice of the Court all those

relevant facts which, if filed, be taken notice of by the High

Court and thereafter dispose of the review application in

accordance with law.

We order accordingly giving liberty to the petitioners to file such a Review Application which shall be considered and disposed of in accordance with law. We also make it clear that since we are giving liberty to the petitioners to file a review petition, delay, if any, caused in filing the review application shall be condoned by the High Court.

The petitions are disposed of accordingly.
