UPON hearing the counsel the Court made the following
O R D E R

1. The instant special leave petition is directed against the interim orders dated 31.03.2006 and 28.04.2006 passed by a Division Bench of the High Court of Delhi in a pending writ petition. Vide these orders, the High Court restricted the entry of trucks in Sadar Bazar, Qutub Road, and other wholesale markets in Delhi. The petitioner - Association of Transporters, having 318 members, approached this Court challenging the above-mentioned interlocutory orders *inter alia* on the grounds that the impugned orders have brought the entire trading activity in Delhi to a standstill, that

the trucks are allowed to enter the city in the night, and the loading/unloading of material also happens during the night only.

2. When the matter came up for hearing on 05.05.2006, this Court stayed the operation of the impugned orders of the High Court. It is not in dispute that the stay is still operative. Meanwhile, we are informed by learned counsel for the Municipal Corporation, Delhi that the main writ petition itself has been disposed of by the High Court.

3. That being so, the impugned interim orders dated 31.03.2006 and 28.04.2006 have lost their effectivity and are consequently, set aside.

4. However, it does not mean that the NCT of Delhi will not take necessary measures to ensure the regulated activities of the heavy vehicles entering the city. In this regard, if no regulatory measures have been taken so far, the State Government and the Municipal Corporation shall be obligated to take appropriate decisions.

5. With these directions, the special leave petition is disposed of.

6. All pending applications, if any, also stand disposed of.
