the Court made the following
O R D E R**

(i) Against the orders¹ of rejection of regular bail by the High Court of Calcutta and to seek bail, the present special leave petitions have been filed.

(ii) The petitioners are in custody

Order dated 12.02.2026 in CRM (NDPS) No. 261 of 2026

w.e.f.17.11.2024 in connection with FIR No.718 of 2024 dated 17.11.2024 for the offences punishable under Section 20(b) (ii)(c) of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985 ('NDPS' for short), registered with Police Station Contai, Sub Division Contai, District Purba Medinipur.

(iii) After hearing learned counsel and considering the fact that the custody of the petitioners is 1½ years, the recovery as alleged is of 13 kilograms Ganja from petitioner (Raja SK), 11.490 kilograms from petitioner (Dipak Tewari) and 10.56 kilograms from petitioner (Gobinda Sharma) out of the total quantity of 132.7 kilograms recovered from 11 accused. The charge under Section 29 NDPS has not been

framed against the accused persons and out of 15, only 02 witnesses have been examined yet. However, considering all the attending circumstances and the fact that the co-accused (Mina SK) has been granted bail by this Court *vide* order dated 19.01.2026 in SLP (Crl.) No. 18518 of 2025 though considering the medical issues also; in the facts of the present case, without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, we deem it appropriate to release the petitioners on bail.

(iv) Accordingly, we direct to release the petitioners on bail on furnishing the suitable bail bonds and sureties and on such other terms and conditions as may be deemed fit by the trial Court.

(v) Petitioners to abide all the conditions as imposed and shall regularly attend the trial until exempted by the Court. Violation, if any, may give a cause to take recourse as permissible and the trial Court is at liberty to do the needful.

(vi) Accordingly, and in view of the foregoing, the special leave petitions stand allowed. Pending application(s), if any, shall stand disposed of.
