UPON hearing the counsel the Court made the following
O R D E R

1. The petitioner challenges the impugned judgment and order dated 29.01.2026 in Criminal Misc. Bail Application No.38361 of 2025, titled "*Manish Mishra Vs. State of U.P.*", passed by the

High Court of Judicature at Allahabad.

2. We have heard learned senior counsel/counsel(s) appearing for the respective parties and perused the material available on record.

3. Even though we are not inclined to interfere with the impugned judgment and order but however, we clarify that if the private respondent is not cooperating in trial in any one of the cases referred to by the State in its counter affidavit, it shall be open for the State/complainant to take steps for cancellation of the bail.

4. Liberty is also granted to the State to challenge the bail orders in any of the other connected matters, wherein the private respondent is an accused.

5. In the event that the trial is not progressing only on account of non-appearance of the co-accused, the Trial Court shall segregate the trial and ensure that trial, particularly in respect of those cases which were registered prior to 2011, is concluded expeditiously, and preferably within a period of one year from today.

6. The learned counsel for the State undertakes that the State shall produce all witnesses on such dates as may be fixed by the Trial Court.

7. Accordingly, the Special Leave Petition is disposed of.

8. Pending application(s), if any, shall stand disposed of.
