Leave granted.

The appellant has been convicted under Section

326/34 of the IPC for having caused injuries to Mahesh

(PW.2) with a lathi that he was carrying at the time of the incident. The injuries attributed to the appellant are as under:

"(1) Lacerated wound 2 cm x 1 cm x 1 cm on upper ½ of the right leg and swelling around the wound 8 cm x 62 cm. Injury caused by hard and blunt object.

(2) Lacerated wound 2cm x 1 cm x 1 cm on middle of leg and swelling around the wound 10 cm x 8 cm on while leg. Injury caused by hard and blunt object."

It is admitted that there were fractures below the injuries. The appellant has been awarded a sentence of five years for having caused these injuries. We are of the

opinion that the sentence is somewhat excessive.

Accordingly, we reduce the sentence of the appellant for the offence under Section 326/34 from five years to three years; the other part of the sentence will remain as it is.

With this modification in the sentence, the appeal is disposed of.
