UPON hearing the counsel the Court made the following
O R D E R

1. Heard learned counsel for the parties in the presence of the petitioner 'Vaneet Mahajan' and the respondent No. 2-mother, 'Usha Mahajan', who have

appeared through virtual mode.

2. The Special Leave Petition was dismissed by this Court *vide* order dated 06.02.2026.

3. Now, by means of the present miscellaneous application, prayer of recall of the aforesaid order has been made. It is prayed that the petitioner/applicant be granted pre-arrest bail as the parties have settled the matter and there is no dispute subsisting between them.

4. The dispute is between the respondent No.2-mother and the eldest son-petitioner. Both have appeared virtually and have submitted before the Court on their own free will that all disputes have been sorted out and that, the mother does not want to press her complaint against him as after all he is her eldest son.

5. In view of the aforesaid subsequent developments, we consider it appropriate to direct that no coercive steps shall be taken against the petitioner pursuant to FIR No. 43 of 2025 dated 01.06.2025 registered with Police Station Majitha Road, Amritsar under Sections 420, 465, 467, 468, 471, 120-B of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 and that he need not surrender. Accordingly, paragraph '3' and '4' contained in our order dated 06.02.2026 stands deleted.

6. The miscellaneous application along with IA No. 70450/2026 stand disposed of with the aforesaid directions.

7. Pending application(s), if any, shall stand disposed of.
