## O R D E R

This petition is directed against the  
judgment of the learned Single Judge, who allowed the  
appeal filed by the respondents-claimants and enhanced  
the compensation awarded by the Motor Accident Claims  
Tribunal from Rs.3,57,000/- to Rs.5,44,000/- and  
directed the petitioners to pay the balance amount with  
interest at the rate of 6% per annum excluding the  
period of delay of 210 days in filing the appeal.

We have heard Shri S.N. Bhat, learned counsel  
for the petitioner and carefully perused the record.

In our considered view, the impugned judgment  
does not suffer from any legal infirmity so as to  
warrant interference under Article 136 of the

Constitution. The special leave petition is  
accordingly dismissed.

The petitioner is directed to pay the balance  
amount together with interest to the respondents within  
a period of four weeks by getting prepared a demand  
draft in the name of respondent no.1 and deposit the  
same in her bank account.

A report showing compliance of this direction  
shall be filed in the Registry of the Karnataka High  
Court, which shall list the matter before the concerned  
Bench for perusal of the report.
