UPON hearing the counsel the court made the following  
O R D E R

1. The SLP (C) was dismissed on 06.02.2026 but the petitioner was allowed two months' time to vacate the premises subject to an undertaking on affidavit.
2. In pursuance of the said order, the petitioner filed an undertaking stating he will vacate the

premises within two months and that he will pay the usual rent as compensation for use and occupation till the possession is handed over.

2. Despite the above, the petitioner has not vacated the premises.

3. Now, the petitioner has moved an application seeking extension of time on the ground of some ailments.

4. Just, by way of compassion, we extend the time for vacating the premises by one month from today provided the petitioner furnishes a fresh undertaking within a week from today that he will hand over peaceful possession of the premises within a month and shall clear all outstanding dues and shall make payment of usual rent as compensation till the vacation of the premises.

5. The Miscellaneous Application stands disposed of accordingly.
