Heard the learned counsel.

We find not merit to interfere with the impugned order. The special leave petition is dismissed.

At this stage, the learned senior counsel for the petitioners submitted that the petitioners are in occupation of the property in question since 1934 and some reasonable time may be granted to them to vacate and deliver the possession of the premises to the respondent. The learned counsel for the respondent, on caveat, when asked about the time, he submitted that any reasonable time could be granted, as deemed fit. Having regard to the facts and circumstances of the case, we grant time to the petitioners to vacate the premises and deliver the vacant possession to the respondent on or before 31st March, 2003, subject to their filing usual undertaking in this court within four weeks from today.
