However, having regard to the fact that the
petitioners are residing in various parts of the country
and in order to obviate any inconvenience to them, we
direct the XV Metropolitan Magistrate, City Criminal

Courts, Hyderabad, V Metropolitan Magistrate, City Criminal Courts, at Hyderabad, Judicial Magistrate First Class, Third Court, Surat, to dispose of the cases, namely, C.C. Nos. 33, 34, 35 & 36/97, CC 526/98 C.C. 3537/98, respectively, as far as possible, in the next 3 hearings of the cases.

Learned counsel appearing for the parties agree that the parties in the trial Court will cooperate in the early disposal of these matters.

In the event the matter is likely to be adjourned for any unavoidable causes, the petitioners may be intimated in advance to avoid unnecessary travel. The Court will consider the convenience of the petitioners while disposing of applications for dispensing with their presence.

The Special Leave Petitions are disposed of accordingly.
