O R D E R

The petitioner-wife seeks transfer of FCOP (Divorce) No. 710/2025, titled "*Abbaraju V.S. Sai Teja vs. Abbaraju @ Poolla Sriya Suhrudi*" pending before the learned Family Judge/XII Addl. District Judge, Guntur, Andhra Pradesh, to the learned Presiding Judge, Family Court, Hyderabad, Telangana.

By order dated 17.04.2026, this Court granted interim stay of further proceedings in the said case.

Notice having been served, the respondent-husband filed a counter affidavit, stating that, without prejudice to his contentions on merits, he had no objection to the transfer of the case from Guntur, Andhra Pradesh, to Hyderabad, Telangana.

Having heard the learned counsel for the petitioner and in view of the clear averment made by the respondent-husband in the counter affidavit, the transfer petition is allowed in the interest of justice.

Accordingly, FCOP (Divorce) No. 710/2025, titled "*Abbaraju*

*V.S. Sai Teja vs. Abbaraju @ Poolla Sriya Suhrudi*" pending before the learned Family Judge/XII Addl. District Judge, Guntur, Andhra Pradesh, is directed to be transferred to the learned Presiding Judge, Family Court, Hyderabad, Telangana, who may hear the case or transfer it to another Court of competent jurisdiction.

Records of the case shall be immediately transferred to the transferee Court.

To cut short delay, parties are directed to appear before the transferee Court on 20.07.2026. On the said date and thereafter, the parties may appear in person or through their authorized representatives or through video-conferencing, if the said facility is available in the transferee Court and is permitted by it. In case there is non-appearance on behalf of any party on the date fixed by this Court, notice shall be issued by the transferee Court to the defaulting party.

The parties may explore the possibility of settlement through mediation. The transferee Court may obtain the desire and wishes of the parties in this regard and proceed accordingly.

The transferee Court may decide the matter expeditiously.

Pending application(s), if any, shall stand disposed of.
