for the petitioner.Looking to the urgency involved, we deem it fit

The petitioner is aggrieved by an order dated 17.5.2010 passed by learned single Judge of the High Court of Punjab & Haryana at Chandigarh whereunder the petitioner's application filed under Section 438 of the CrPC for grant of anticipatory bail in connection with FIR dated 27.9.2009 for alleged commission of offences under Section 306/34 of IPC has since been rejected.

Learned senior counsel for the petitioner contended that no ingredients as contemplated under Section 306 of IPC have been made out against the present petitioner. It was also brought to our notice that on a statement recorded of the co-accused under Section 161, the present petitioner has been roped in.

On consideration of submission as advanced, we direct that on the petitioner applying for grant of regular bail within a period of 10 days hereof, the same would be considered by the learned Trial Judge on merits and in accordance with law. The petitioner is directed to furnish a copy thereof to the Government Pleader well

in advance so as to enable him to secure the case diary.

For a period of ten days, the petitioner shall not be arrested.

With the aforesaid observation, this petition stands disposed of.
