Having heard the learned counsel for the parties we are of the opinion that

interest of justice would be subserved if in lieu of passing a direction for

reinstatement, the respondent is compensated by the appellant. Accordingly the

appellant is directed to pay a sum of Rs.50,000/- to the respondent.
