Vakalatnama given in the Court by Mr. D.K. Sinha, learned counsel for the petitioner, is taken on record.

By order dated 18.07.2011 notice was given to respondent No. 3-mother of the children only on the question of visitation rights of the petitioner-father.

Respondent No. 3 has appeared in the Court today and stated that she has no objection to the visitation rights of the petitioner, but her apprehension is that in the garb of visitation rights the petitioner will remove the children from India and take them to the United States.

Having heard learned counsel for the petitioner and respondent No. 3, we direct that the petitioner-father shall have the visitation rights four times in a year. The

petitioner, however, before visiting the children, shall give notice to the mother-respondent No. 3 well in advance. It is further directed that the petitioner shall not remove the children beyond the Union Territory of Chandigarh.

With aforesaid directions, the special leave petition stands disposed of accordingly.
