O R D E R

Learned counsel for the appellants as well as the respondents submit that the judgment under appeal be set aside and the case be remitted back to the High Court for a fresh decision in accordance with law after taking into consideration the relevant evidence on the record, on the basis of the pleadings of the parties. It is ordered accordingly.

If the parties wish to amend their pleadings, then it would be up to them to file applications to that effect and the High Court shall decide the same on their own merits, in accordance with law.

Interim orders granted by the High Court while admitting the appeals, shall continue to operate till the final disposal of the appeals by the High Court.

Since the suit from which these proceedings arise pertains to the year 1982, we would request the High Court to take up the appeals on priority basis and dispose them of as expeditiously as possible.

The Registry is directed to transmit the record of the case to the High Court forthwith. The appeals stand disposed of in the above terms. Interim injunction granted by this Court stands vacated.
