UPON hearing the counsel the Court made the following
O R D E R

1. The petitioner has been denied bail by the High Court in connection with Crime No.185/2024 registered with Nai Abadi Police Station, District Mandsaur, State of Madhya Pradesh for the offence punishable under Sections 109 and 3(5), respectively, of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023 (for short, "the BNS, 2023) and Sections 25 and 27, respectively of the Arms Act.
2. It is the case of the prosecution that the petitioner had a firearm in his hands and shot one fire, injuring the injured

witness on his thigh.

3. We also take notice of the fact that the petitioner is in custody since 04.10.2024. So far, only four (4) witnesses have been examined, including the injured witness.

4. The prosecution intends to examine in all 32 witnesses.

5. We fail to understand that in this type of prosecution, more particularly, for the offence of attempt to commit murder, why multiple witnesses are being examined and unnecessarily the trial is being delayed. The most crucial witness would be the petitioner himself and his evidence is over.

6. Be that as it may, we direct the Trial Court to conclude the trial within a period of six months from today.

7. For any good reason, if the trial is not concluded within six months from today, then it shall be open for the petitioner to once again pray for bail before the Trial Court, both on the ground of undue delay and also the period of incarceration.

8. With the aforesaid, the Special Leave Petition stands disposed of.

9. Pending application(s), if any, also stand disposed of.
