O R D E R

This petition is filed by the wife for transfer of a
restitution petition filed under Section 9 of the Hindu
Marriage Act, 1955 by the husband from the Court of Civil
Judge, Senior Division, Jeypore (Orissa) to the Family
Court, Ongole, Prakasam District (A.P.). The petitioner
alleges that she is staying with her parents and is totally

dependent on them; that she has no source of income; that there is nobody in the family who would accompany her to Jeypore to defend the petition and that she apprehends threat to her life at Jeypore.

2. On the facts and circumstances, we are satisfied that this a fit case for transfer.

3. Accordingly, transfer petition is allowed.

Division, Jeypore (Orissa) is ordered to be transferred to the Family Court at Ongole, Prakasam District (A.P.).

Learned counsel for the respondent submitted that respondent has already filed an application for transfer before the Andhra Pradesh High Court for transferring the divorce petition filed by the wife from the Family Court, Ongole to any other appropriate Court in the State. The transfer of the husband's petition for restitution of conjugal rights from Jeypore (Orissa) to the Family Court, Ongole (A.P.) will not come in the way of the High Court considering the question of transfer of cases pending in Ongole (including the case hereby transferred) to any other Court in accordance with law, if the High Court finds such transfer necessary.
