Taken on Board.

The learned counsel for the petitioner had made a statement that the petitioner is willing to deposit the sum of rupees eight lakhs and seventy thousand, which is the amount now due on the cheque, in two instalments, with half of this amount to be deposited within four weeks from today and the balance within eight weeks thereafter.

We accordingly issue a direction that the said

amount be deposited in the Sessions Court in the pending appeal. In case the amount is deposited as

aforsaid, the Session Court will not enforce the non-

bailable warrants. In case the aforsaid amount is not

deposited, the present SLP will be deemed to be dismissed.

We also clarify that the sum of rupees eight lakhs and seventy thousands is only the principal amount and that the Sessions Court while disposing of the appeal may also give such other relief to the complainant with respect to interest etc. and that the Sessions Court will dispose of the matter in accordance with law.

The learned counsel for the petitioner states that the sum of rupees eight lakhs and seventy thousands may be handed over to the complainant so that the entire matter can be sorted out.

The SLPs are accordingly disposed of.
